Doctor discussed ways to prevent pregnancy	Students who responded that a doctor or nurse had discussed ways to prevent pregnancy
Doctor discussed ways to prevent STD/HIV/AIDS	Students who responded that a doctor or nurse had discussed ways to prevent sexually transmitted diseases (STDs) and AIDS or HIV infection with them

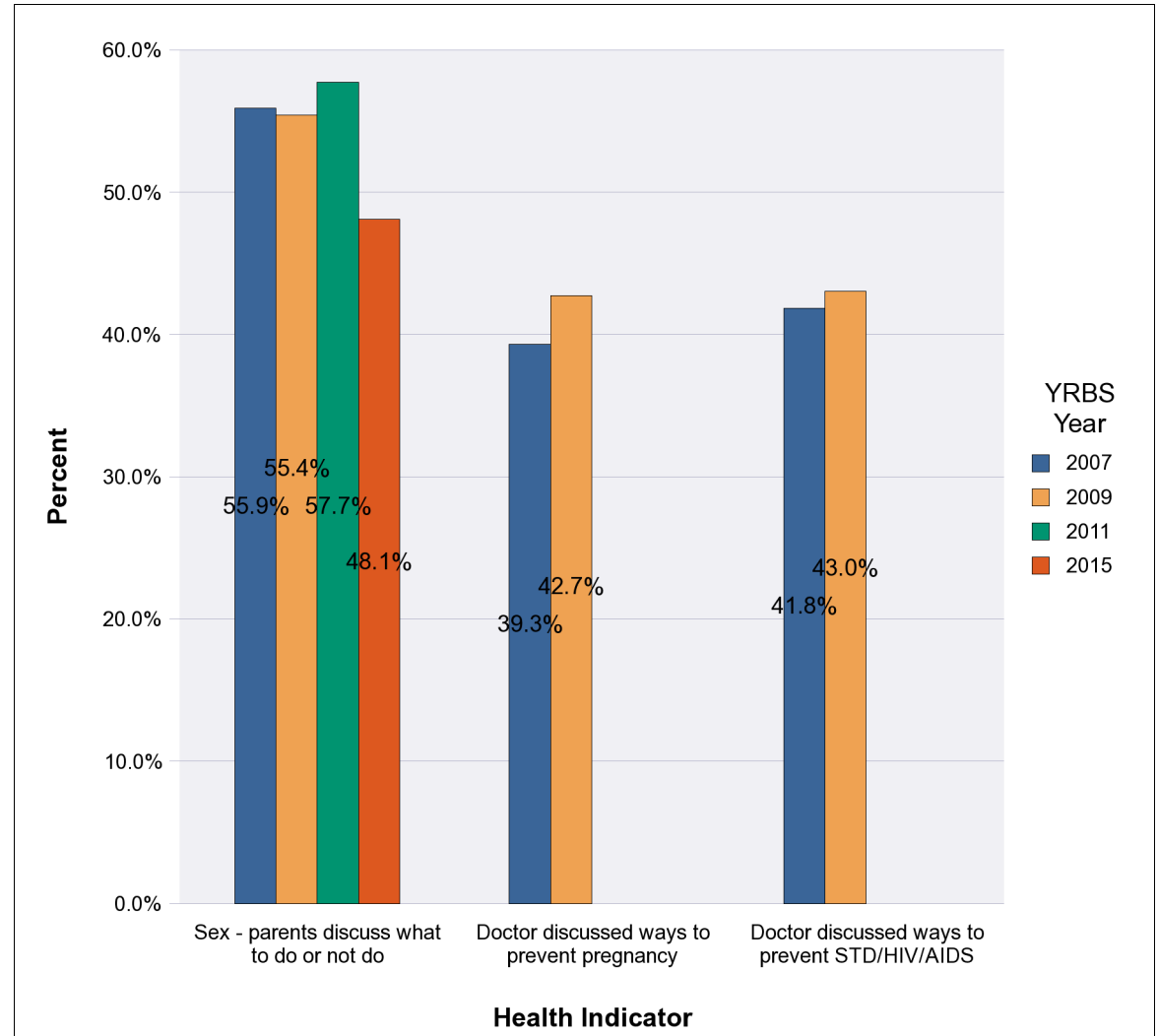

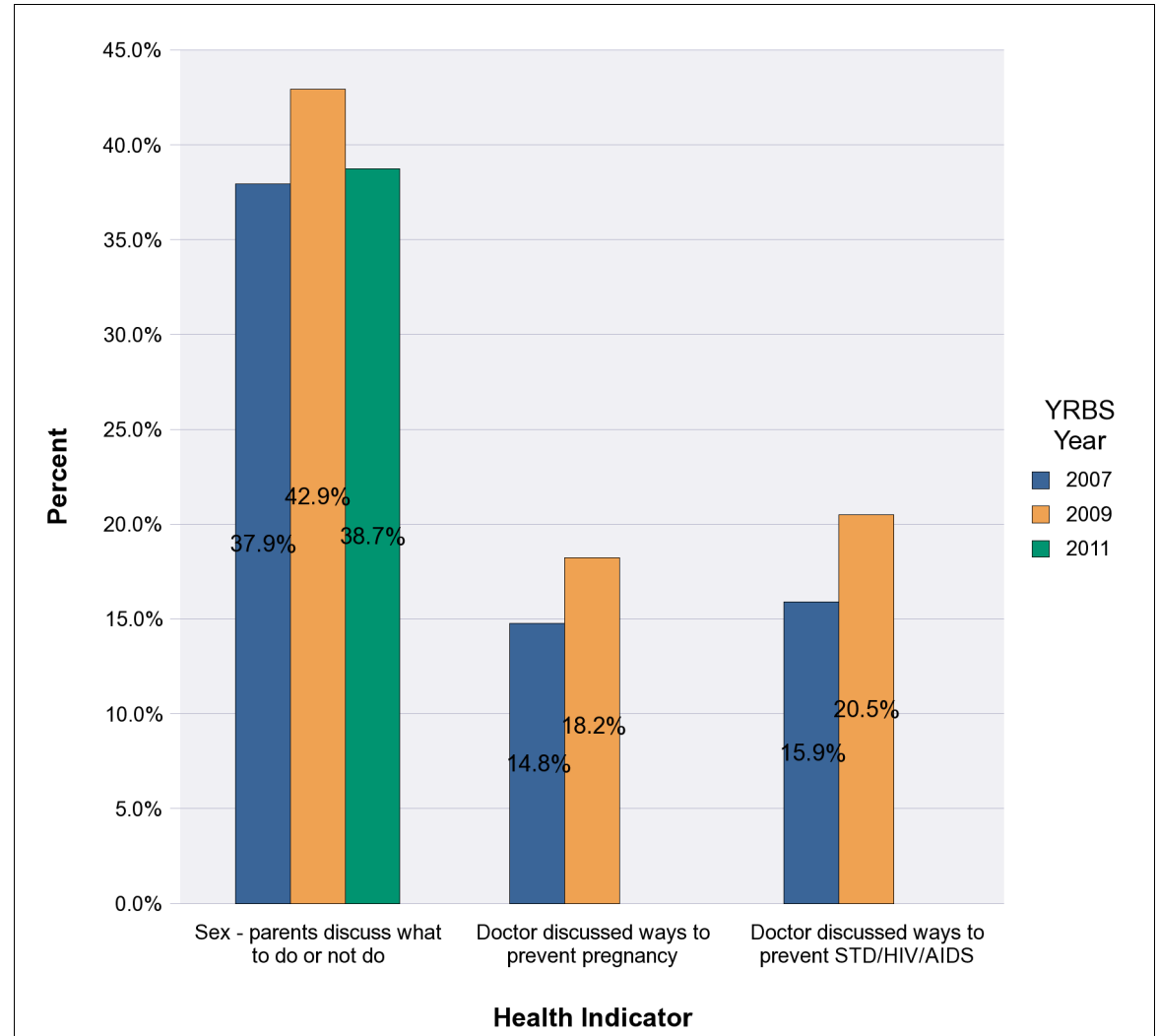
