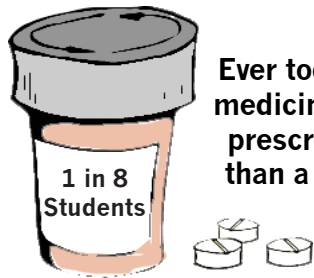
The results are representative of the 42,700 regular public high school students across the state of Hawaii.

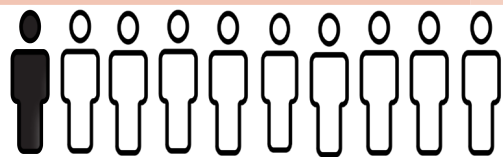

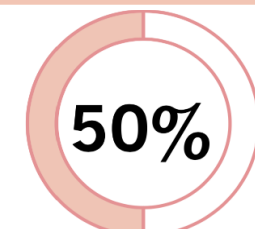
