The Hawai'i School Health Survey is a joint project of the Hawai'i Departments of Education (DOE) and Health (DOH) and the University of Hawai'i's Curriculum Research & Development Group. It is largely funded by the DOH Substance Abuse Block Grant. This publication was supported by Cooperative Agreement number NU87PS004309, funded by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Its contents are solely the responsibility of the authors and do not necessarily represent the official views of the CDC or the Department of Health and Human Services.

The results are representative of the 44,331 regular public high school students across the state of Hawai'i and the 2,611 Kaua'i County public high school students.
