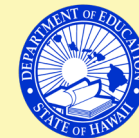
The Hawai'i School Health Survey is a joint project of the Hawai'i Departments of Education (DOE) and Health (DOH) and the University of Hawai'i's College of Education. It is largely funded by the DOH with Substance Use Prevention, Treatment, and Recovery Services Block Grant. This publication was supported by Cooperative Agreement number NU87PS004309, funded by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Its contents are solely the responsibility of the authors and do not necessarily represent the official views of the CDC or the Department of Health and Human Services.

The results are representative of the 25,200 regular public middle school students across the state of Hawai'i.

The Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) is usually administered in the spring semester. Due to COVID-19, the 2021 survey was administered in the fall semester. Students' home and school life was dramatically affected during the COVID-19 pandemic, which combined with change in administration dates, may account for many of the findings.
